- Resignation of Joel Harrison, Water Resources Scientist




Resolution No. 96-19, Rochefort-Lahaye

SUBJECT: Financial Costs of the 2019 Spring Flooding Event

Background:


The spring of 2019 experienced flooding not seen for forty years. Staff were actively responding to the flood at Parks Creek and providing flood forecasts to the media and member municipalities. Flooding was severe throughout the watershed Wasi Lake, Lake Nipissing and the Lower Mattawa River experienced the severe conditions. Twenty seven watershed condition statements, watches and warnings were issued from late April to the middle of June.

Analysis:


Financially the event put two of our program budgets into a deficit: Flood Control and Flood Forecasting. The statements are attached for your information.

The Parks Creek Backflood Control Structure operated for a period of 42 days at a cost of \$69,403.29 for materials, supplies and services. Salary costs are currently in the budget under other various program areas. The salary expenses have simply been transferred to the Flood Control and Flood Forecasting from other program areas.

The Parks Creek Structure benefits the City of North Bay. The Chair approached the City's Chief Financial Officer (CFO) to request the City to offset our additional expenses. A record of expenses and a written explanation for the request were provided to the CFO. The NBMCA has now been compensated for the cost of the operating the structure.
